Commissioner Glen Hebb calls the meeting to order 7 PM Roll Call: Wendy Oickle, Deputy mayor and District 3 councillor.

Couuncillor Oickle due to tight scheduling took the opportunity to report ahead of the meeting. The latest news update on the status at MODL on the Century Drive Project. Under review of correspondence, Lem Hebb reports that the Village commission is working to be in compliance. HVC has attended two workshops. The roles of commissioners and clerks are defined better.

Commissioners Reports:

Commissioner Glen Hebb feels "the flood issue is dead in the water. "Are the PSC aware of the Village situation below the foot of the Hebbville Dam?

He is continuing to offer advice on building resilience and having an evacuation plan.

Commissioner Greg Flinn gives an update on his project to revitalize the Village of Hebbville website. It is moving in the right direction. A website has become mandatory for what is expected to be available material to the public online from each village. He said he struggles for our purpose. He is not alone. In discussing the HVC dealings with the PSC. A visitor, Elsbeth McLean - Wile, running for municipal mayor and her surrogate speaker suggested how to deal/work with MODL.

Commissioner Glen Hebb opened things up for discussion. Flood issues are frustrating but important concerns, voiced several times. Andrew Himmelmam, a visitor. Running for Councillor District #3 presented himself. He mentioned zoning by - laws? A heads up on possible spray entering MODL's watershed that is being investigated. It was pointed out that legal action, not for the Hebbville Village Commission to pursue. The villages themselves would have to do this on their own.
